



WOMEN'S RETREAT TESTIMONIAL

When Fr. Jerome announced at Mass that there would be a Women's Retreat entitled Living in Hope Through Every Season of Life, I thought, "That's just right for me!" since I had recently retired and was an empty nester with young grandchildren. At the lovely Vallombrosa Retreat Center nearby? I signed up right away.

Later, I thought about the fact that I didn't know anyone else who would be there. It turns out, most people didn't know anyone prior to the retreat. However, we left with friends and many familiar faces that I see at Mass.

The retreat was well-organized and balanced—many thoughtful details, moments to think and reflect, and so many interesting speakers. This diversity reflected the women there—from all seasons of life. There were young mothers, women with kiddos in school, and grandmothers and great-grandmothers. We heard talks from women who raised families and also engaged in church activities throughout their lives. I learned that it is never too late to get more involved in service through our church. As we got to know each other and saw many commonalities among ourselves, our discussions became more lively and interesting. The pace was just right—some talking, some reflecting—the day flew by.

We did a "walking Rosary" through the grounds of Vallombrosa and wound up across the street at the Corpus Christi Monastery, where we continued our prayers. We could see the cloistered nuns across the altar and paused for adoration of the Holy Eucharist as well. This activity, in the group of at least fifteen women, enlivened the prayer experience for me and made me feel even more connected to people, place and time.

I'd highly recommend starting the New Year of 2026 with the next Women's Retreat: Living the Sacraments as Women of Faith, organized by the same group of wonderful women, on January 2-4, 2026. Looking forward to meeting you there!

On October 1, 2025, Pope Leo XIV addressed the "Raising Hope" conference on the 10th anniversary of the encyclical *Laudato Si'*.

"Dear friends, let your faith inspire you to be bearers of the hope that comes from recognizing the presence of God already at work in history. Let us recall how Pope Francis described St. Francis of Assisi: He 'lived in simplicity and in wonderful harmony with God, with others, with nature and with himself. He shows us just how inseparable the bond is between concern for nature, justice for the poor, commitment to society, and interior peace' (*Laudato Si'*, 10).

May each of us grow in these four relationships — with God, with others, with nature and with ourselves — through a constant attitude of conversion. Integral ecology thrives on all these relationships. Through our commitment to them, we can grow in hope by living out the interdisciplinary approach of *Laudato Si'* and the call to unity and collaboration that flows from it.

We are one family, with one Father, who makes the sun to rise and sends rain on everyone (cf. Mt 5:45). We inhabit the same planet, and we must care for it together. I, therefore, renew my strong appeal for unity around integral ecology and for peace!

It is encouraging to see the variety of organizations represented at this conference, as well as the

wide range organizations have joined that the Laudato Si' Movement and the Platform for Action. 1 would like to conclude with question



that concerns each of us. God will ask us if we have cultivated and cared for the world that he created (cf. Gen 2:15), for the benefit of all and for future generations, and if we have taken care of our brothers and sisters (cf. Gen 4:9; Jn 13:34). What will be our answer?"

40 DAYS FOR LIFE

God took me up on my offer to do "anything You ask of me, Lord". He has quite a sense of humor. He asked me to do something I find really hard, getting up early in the morning. I consider 6 AM early. But, the harder something is, the more blessings. So, I found myself at 40 Days with Jessica Munn at just before 7 AM on a cold damp morning.

But the blessings were there! As we were saying our rosary a young woman about 17 or 18 stopped and faced us. We stopped our prayers and said, "good morning". She then told us her mother was a pastor and that we were doing God's work and being great examples of God's love. She went on with more encouragement and thanks for our presence there! Finally, she blessed us and left. We were very surprised and delighted.

Soon a man in his 40s stopped and said we were in the right place—praying outside of the "tower of Baal". He went on about the evil being done there and that our presence was going to make a difference. Again, we were surprised and delighted!

We went on to complete our rosary and as we were finishing, the shadow of a cross appeared on the fence across the street. It stayed there about 15 minutes, not moving or changing shape. We tried to find what could be the source of the shadow, but none of the poles were in the right place or turned the right direction to cast this shadow. Then it disappeared as quickly as it had appeared. That was just as we were finishing our rosary.

It was one early (for me) morning I will cherish.




