

Very often, Christ meets us through them—in their kindness, gratitude, and humanity.


We humbly ask for your support. Your donations make these encounters possible and by



Simbang Gabi - December 15-23

What is Simbang Gabi? Simbang Gabi (translation: Masses at Night) is a long treasured Filipino spiritual tradition. In the Philippines, it was celebrated as a series of nine dawn Masses right before Christmas, each Mass followed by a reception and fellowship. For pastoral reasons, these daily novena Masses are now also celebrated in the evening. Set within Advent, Simbang Gabi invites participants to heighten their preparation for the birth of Jesus, as well as honor the Blessed Virgin Mary.

DOMINICAN CORNER

How Can We Prepare for Christ's Coming?

The second coming of Christ — that will be a surprise for us because we won't know when it will happen. It could be a sad and terrifying surprise, but it could also be a happy surprise.

How can we make the second option our reality?

Think of how happy you are when a close friend comes and surprises you. You are happy because you want to see him and you love to spend time with him. It works with Christ as well. And so, we need to develop a relationship with Him.

How do we do that?

Well, we need to remember that we are travelers. We are on our way to God. So, like when we travel, we stay in contact with our friend by calling to him, sending text and voice messages, so too with God. That's our individual prayer. We want to stay in touch with God, share with Him our journey and listen to Him.

Sometimes God does not respond immediately like people on a social media, but He is responding. He's responding through the Bible when you are reading the word of the Lord and through other people.

But when you have a close friend you want to meet him in person. And that's what happens in the Eucharist. The body and the blood of Jesus Christ are truly present at Mass so we can be with our closest friend in person.

That's the best way to meet with Christ, during Eucharist. But as we said we are travelers so we are not 24-hours with God in this sacrament, so we need to meet Him in individual prayer as well.

In the second coming of Christ we shouldn't focus on when it will happen because we will be surprised anyway. But we should start to build our relationship with God today, so when He will come it wouldn't be terrifying but it will be the happiest thing that we have ever experienced in our lives.
