

DOMINICAN CORNER

What's So Great About John the Baptist?

Br. Francis Dominic Nguyen, O.P., reflects on the Gospel for the Third Sunday of Advent (Mt 11:2-11)

What's so great about St. John the Baptist? We hear today that among those born of women there has been none greater than John the Baptist. If we observe carefully, the Gospel passage today gives us at least one good reason why: John the Baptist is so careful to lead others to Christ. He already knew that Jesus was the Christ, because he saw the Spirit descend upon Jesus when he baptized Him. Yet, he sent his disciples to ask Jesus, "are you the one who is to come?"

Jesus answers them with this: "Go and tell John what you see and hear:

the blind regain their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have good news proclaimed to them."

Now, notice carefully how Jesus began his answer. He said, "go and tell John what you see and hear."

What astonishes me about this verse is that within it, you already get an example the blind seeing! The disciples themselves were some of the blind ones — blind to the fact that Jesus was the Messiah. The fact that John the Baptist needed to send them to Jesus to ask this question suggests that perhaps they were not willing to listen to him, and they were deaf to his preaching about Jesus as the Messiah. But, St. John the Baptist knows the right cure to open the ears of those deaf to his preaching about Jesus. It is to go straight to Jesus and to let yourself be amazed by the countless miracles Jesus works in your life and in the lives of those around you. Let us too open our eyes and ears to this reality.

Again, "what's so great about St. John the Baptist?" He is great in humility. Like a good road sign, he doesn't put the focus on himself but on the destination and on the Truth. Everything he did was about preparing the way for the Lord. As we look forward to Christmas, may we, too, imitate his great humility and point others to Jesus, the one who comes to save. •




