Through service, prayer, and companionship, St. Peter's Migrant Ministry walks with migrant families, offering support, dignity, and Christ's love.

Each year, migrant farm workers come to the Eastern Shore to work long hours in challenging conditions, often without the social and material support systems many of us rely on. While basic housing and transportation are provided, many workers and families face ongoing hardships and isolation.

St. Peter's Migrant Ministry seeks to be the welcoming embrace of the Catholic Church for our migrant brothers and sisters. Through the support of sister parishes in the Diocese of Richmond, the ministry provides food, clothing, emergency assistance, transportation help, and other essential resources to make their stay more dignified and secure.

Most importantly, the ministry offers spiritual care—celebrating Mass in migrant camps and providing access to the sacraments—so that migrant workers and families know they are not alone and that the Church walks with them in faith, compassion, and fellowship.

Creation Care Good News

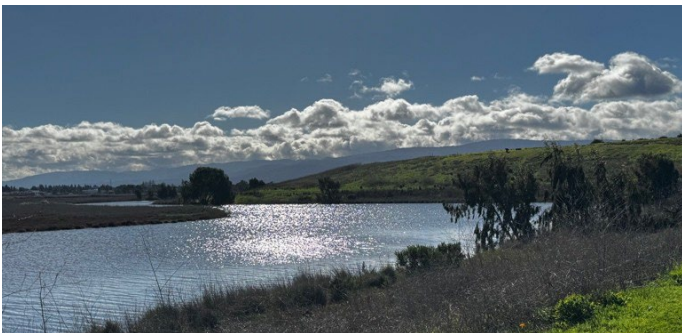
The ozone hole over Antarctica has shrunk to its fifth smallest size in more than three decades. The reduction has been made possible by regulations on ozone-depleting substances as outlined in the Montreal Protocol treaty ratified by all nations in the UN in 1987, making it one of the most successful environmental treaties ever. Ozone-depleting substances have decreased by 30% due to the collective participation of countries across the globe.

Why it matters: The ozone layer functions as a global shield against harmful levels of ultraviolet solar radiation. A weakened ozone layer can increase rates of skin cancer and cataracts and significantly harm crop yields.

Also, the International Energy Agency reported the world is rapidly moving towards the use of predominantly renewable energy. Renewable, clean energy contributed 34.3% of global electricity, outpacing coal, which accounted for 33.1% for the first time.

Pope Benedict XVI and Pope St. John Paul II said the ecological crisis "is a moral issue... it reveals the urgent need for a new solidarity... States must increasingly share responsibility for the promotion of a natural and social environment that is both peaceful and healthy." Pope Francis hoped all people would recognize their duty to care for God's great gift of creation. In the examples above, nations working together made a difference.

Pope Leo XIV said, "The mission of safeguarding creation, of bringing peace and reconciliation, is the mission entrusted to us... The church must speak **prophetically** even when it requires **boldness** to oppose the destructive power of the princes of this world. We listen to the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor because this cry has reached the heart of God."

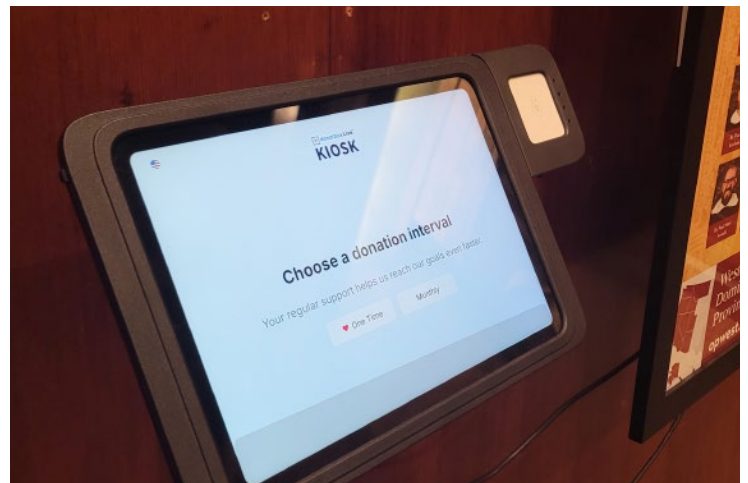
