These fences are in place to safely prepare for an exciting renovation project that will make our church more inviting and beautiful for everyone in our community.

Key improvements include:

- Replacing the outdated front glass with clean, welcoming windows and entry features that better reflect the open, hospitable spirit of our parish.
- Removing and replacing the current concrete patio with a more attractive, user-friendly outdoor space perfect for fellowship and gatherings.

By God's grace and your generous support, we aim to complete the major work in time for Easter — so we can celebrate the Resurrection in an even more beautiful home!

We are so grateful for your patience during construction — thank you for bearing with the noise, dust, and temporary changes.

Registration in the religious education program is open year-long. It's never too late to join and/or to bring your friends too.

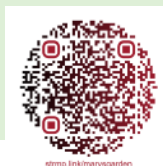


Mary's Garden Summer Camp

Living the Gospel in Virginia

- June 13-19, in Eastern Shore VA

Through service, prayer, and companionship, St. Peter's Migrant Ministry walks with migrant families, offering support, dignity, and Christ's love.

Each year, migrant farm workers come to the Eastern Shore to work long hours in challenging conditions, often without the social and material support systems many of us rely on. While basic housing and transportation are provided, many workers and families face ongoing hardships and isolation.

St. Peter's Migrant Ministry seeks to be the welcoming embrace of the Catholic Church for our migrant brothers and sisters. Through the support of sister parishes in the Diocese of Richmond, the ministry provides food, clothing, emergency assistance, transportation help, and other essential resources to make their stay more dignified and secure.

Most importantly, the ministry offers spiritual care—celebrating Mass in migrant camps and providing access to the sacraments—so that migrant workers and families know they are not alone and that the Church walks with them in faith, compassion, and fellowship.

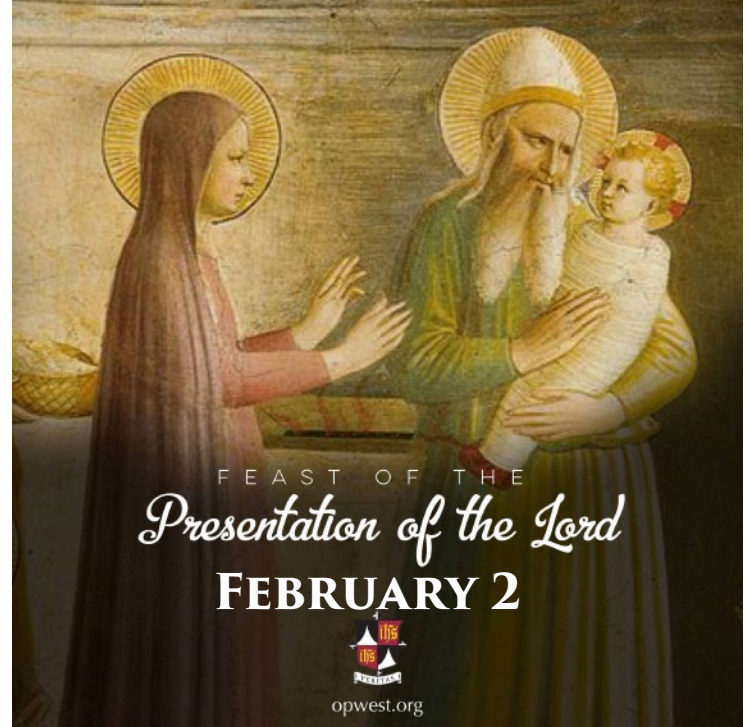

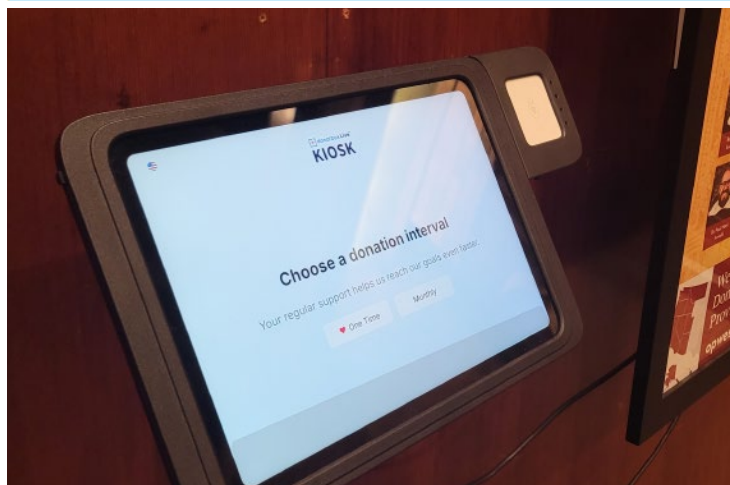
