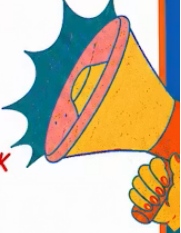

June, July, August 2026

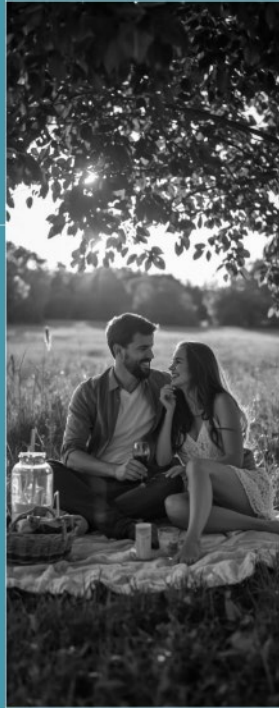
Marriage grows through small, intentional moments. This summer, commit to one date per month for three months and watch how simple connection can renew your marriage.

"I am so happy that I was able to participate in this year's service trip to Virginia. 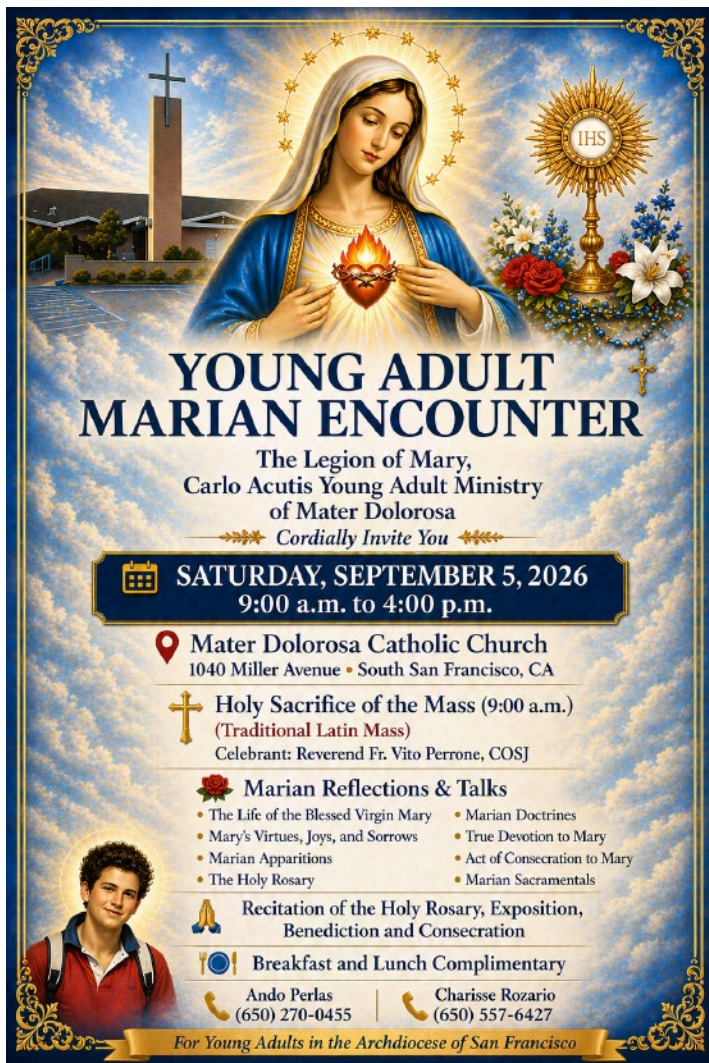
